

Case Report Helpful Tips

Keywords: words that common in your case report, like a **fungal infection**. *You can write up to four words.*

Introduction: one or two paragraphs which represent as a background to the case. For instance, if you are writing a case report about an HIV (-VE) gentleman with cryptococcal infection, what is the reason for this gentleman low immunity? You are going to expand on what you think is the main cause for your case report.

Case Report: in this section, you would include only a short story about your case. You can add one/two images that are pertinent to the case.

Discussion: in this section, you are trying to prove that the introduction (let's say the low immunity) is the culprit that led to his fungal infection. Additionally, you could include any updated clinical based evidence about your case.

Note: **introduction and discussion** sections **must be** supported with previous research work. For example, if I want to say low immunity is the main reason this gentleman to develop a fungal infection in the brain, I should include a reference to my sentence. Total reference in a case report **should not exceed ten references**.

Conclusion: is a short paragraph that summarizes the main reason of writing this case report. In other words, learning objectives.
