

Writing Guidelines Document

Title Page

Make your title between 90 to 96 characters in length, including spaces, punctuation, and subtitle. The title has to be attracting and informative.

What to write on the title page? It should include names of the authors followed by their highest academic degrees (MD, Ph.D.) and their institutional affiliations. Provide full contact information (name, address, telephone number, fax number, and email address) for the corresponding author.

The corresponding author must mention who conducted the statistical analysis with their professional affiliation (academic, governmental, or commercial) listed.

Provide any "Supplemental Data" below the authors' affiliations. In the title page, you should declare if the article:

- The article was previously published.
- The author received any funding, like NIH.

Abstract

Crystal clear abstract with no more than 250 words. The abstract should contain a few statistics and has the following sections:

1. Objectives
2. Method
3. Result
4. Conclusion

Introduction: No more than 250 words and must contain no reiteration information.

Methods: Should be detailed.

Data Availability Policy:

At the end of the method section, state if the Data is available and other researchers can get it.

Figures: *no more than two*. "Permission is required if applicable." Colored figures are published with no additional charge. Each figure has a short title above/below the figure. Multipart figures should be labeled in the upper left corner as A, B, C, etc., and read from left to right.

Line graphs should be solid rather than dots or dashes.

CT, MRI, etc. It should be devoid of white color.

Tables: should be without shading or color. Tables must be created in Word and included with the manuscript file. All tables must be double spaced. Each table must be numbered. References within the table should be numbers, not names.

Tables should contain no images and should only be constructed using the table function available in Word and included as part of the manuscript document file.

Reference: Reference style must either be **APA** or **NLM**.

The entire article must be no longer than **2,500 words**, excluding references.

Note: case report must be no longer than **1,000 words**, excluding references.
